SUMMER CAMP KIT LIST

1	Rucksack	<i>The Scouts use rucksacks on a number of events during the year (Lemming, Paw, hikes, camps etc. It is better to speak to one of the leaders before buying one)</i> Suggest 65 litre or larger - Don't forget the thick plastic liner, in case of rain
1	Daysack	
1	Scout Uniform & Coat Hanger	<i>To be used traveling to and from camp as well as on several occasions during camp. We recommend that a coat hanger be packed so that the uniform can be hung up in the tent.</i>
1	Sleeping Bag	<i>Recommend that minimum is three seasons but would suggest a four season.</i>
1	Karrimat/ Roll mat	<i>Foam material placed under sleeping bag and available from Camping & General ('C&G')</i>
1	Bivouac bag	<i>Optional - in essence these are strong highly coloured plastic bags which are for use in emergencies and also used to provide insulation under a sleeping bag or to lay kit on for inspections</i> <i>Also known as a survival bag</i>
1	Walking Boots (not school shoes or trainers)	<i>These should be waterproof but not Wellington boots</i>
1	Strong Trainers	<i>Optional - to take two pairs as they invariably get one pair wet</i>
1	Flip flops or equivalent	<i>Optional - but useful for showers, beach etc.</i>
1	Set of Waterproofs	<i>Trousers and jacket</i>
7	T-shirts	<i>Most scouts live in a pair (usually the same pair) of football shorts and shirt for the entire week.</i> <i>Some of the t-shirts should be long sleeved</i>
2	Warm top and/or fleece	
2	Trousers	<i>We recommend, for a number of reasons, combats rather than jeans. Shell suit types will not be permitted due to the fact the Scouts are working around open fires.</i>
2	Shorts	<i>See comments on T-shirts</i>

2	Socks for walking boots

1	Nightwear	<i>Most Scouts prefer shorts and a t-shirt</i>
1	Towel	
1	Hat	Essential
1	Swimming costume	
1	Wash flannel	<i>Recommended that the washing kit is kept in a toilet bag</i>
1	Soap/Shower Gel	
1	Shampoo	
1	Toothbrush/ paste	
1	Deodorant	<i>No aerosol cans</i>
1	Face towel	
1	Brush/Comb

1	Tea Towel	
1	Dinner plate	<i>Plates and mug to be unbreakable (plastic, metal or enamel and to be marked with the Scouts name. Do not use sticking plaster as this comes off in the wash. Suggest enamel paint or nail varnish). These items and the knife fork and spoon are to be kept in a bag.</i>
1	Soup/dessert Bowl

	Knife, Fork & Spoon	<i>Metal not plastic</i>
1	Water bottle	1 ltr or 2 500ml bottles
1	Torch	With spare batteries

	Plastic bags	<i>Clothes should be packed in plastic bags. Also for dirty washing</i>

	Compass	<i>Optional</i>
	Penknife	Optional – Subject to approval by leaders
	Medication	<i>In a bag a labelled with your name</i>

Notes

- The Scout Group cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to any personal effects and the Scout Association does not provide automatic insurance for such items.
- If your child requires medication while on camp please hand it in to a leader in a named container giving full details of medication required
- **All equipment and clothing must be clearly marked with the owner's name;** engraving or permanent ink are far better than nail varnish or stuck on labels.
- A certain amount of pocket money is recommended. Money may be handed to camp-leader for safety and will be given out as required. The Scout Group is otherwise not responsible for losses.
- Please do not include any electronic games, phones, radios or mp3 players.
- Aerosols, matches, lighters and any other flammable liquid or gas must never be brought to camps; these are dangerous and not necessary.
- Kit should be packed in the rucksack. It is important that there are no loose items. Line the kit bag with a plastic bag.
- Due to the nature of camps and activities, it is advisable to wear old clothing and footwear as there is a good chance they will get very wet, dirty and/or damaged.
- Earrings, nose rings, and other decorative jewellery are not recommended on camps and activities.
